
The President's Prattle

Because of flooding and landslides on the roads to Blackbutt, I decided on Sunday 9 January to cancel the rally planned for the Blackbutt Showgrounds on 15 & 16 January 2011. This was in the interests of member safety, and to avoid damage to our vehicles and caravans and to the Blackbutt Showgrounds. At the time, however, I was not aware of the extent of flooding to Ipswich and Brisbane that would subsequently occur.

The suddenness and severity of the flooding in Toowoomba and Grantham and Withcott that resulted in carnage and multiple deaths demonstrates the fragility of human life. We should be thankful that no club members were injured or killed during the January 2011flood.

I understand that two members suffered severe flooding of their homes. I extend the sympathy of the club to these members and to any other member and the family and friends of our members who have suffered flood damage. I also encourage everyone to help our communities to the best of our individual abilities to recover from this devastating flood.

I hope to catch up with many of you at our February rally at Crows Nest.

How to Get There

Follow Warrego Highway to Toowoomba. At the top of the range, turn right into Dawne Street, and then immediately left into Margaret Street, passing Queens Park. At the end of Queens Park, turn right into Hume Street and then left at next traffic lights (Chalk Drive). Turn right into Ruthven Street (which becomes the New England Highway) and follow for approx. 43 kms to the outskirts of Crows Nest. The caravan park is on the left approx 1 km before town of Crows Nest.

OR.... From Esk... Follow Esk-Hampton Road to Hampton. Turn right and follow New England Highway for approx 11 kms to the outskirts of Crows Nest. The caravan park is on the left approx 1 km before town of Crows Nest.

We will keep in touch in case we can offer practical help.

I am also aware of members who live not far from the Brisbane River who resorted to sandbagging around their home to safeguard their property. We think of you too ... the watching, and the waiting, and the uncertainty.

The whole thing is very sobering indeed. My heart goes out to those in Toowoomba and the Lockyer Valley who were hit suddenly with a wall of water. It would be funny if it wasn't so horrifying – Toowoomba in flood! We have friends who live in Helidon and we were very worried until we managed to speak with them.

A very special mention must be made of the emergency workers, from Queensland, interstate and New Zealand, who worked tirelessly to help those affected by the floods throughout the state – we couldn't have done without them.

We did hear tales of some looting of abandoned homes, but these tales were few. There will always be vultures. But I'd rather think of those nice, decent people who made themselves available to help their neighbours, many of whom were strangers – a much more pleasant concept.



Of course, the rally at Blackbutt was cancelled. Who could enjoy a rally amidst all the trauma, even if the grounds had been accessible? When the Blackbutt Showgrounds people contacted us to advise that the rally should be cancelled, we weren't surprised (nor sorry, I have to admit). 2-Way Radio Etiquette

2-way radios, used correctly, can be a very convenient tool. Although we have 40 channels available on our 2-way radio, did you know that some of them have pre-allocated uses, by law?

The following channels are pre-allocated and must be used only for the purpose noted below:

<u>Channel</u>	<u>Purpose</u>
5 & 35	For emergency use only
1 to 8 & 31 to 38	These are for Duplex use only.
11	This is the call channel, by law.
22 & 23	For telemetry and remote control devices use only. Voice communications are not allowed.

The following channels are available for general use:

<u>Channel</u>	<u>Purpose</u>
40	General highway channel, often used by truckies.
9, 10, 12 to 21, 23 to 30 &	These are for general chit-chat. 39
18	Is the unofficial caravanners channel.
20	Is the unofficial CMCA (motor homes)

Protocol is to make the initial call on either channel 11 or 40. Once you have the attention of whom you are calling, you should then switch to one of the general chit chat channels for longer calls.
