How to Get There

From the North – 2 routes:

- (1) From Gympie Arterial Rd, turn <u>left</u> into Strathpine Rd (becomes Gympie Rd). Continue through Strathpine to Petrie. Turn <u>left</u> at the roundabout into Dayboro Rd. * ...
- (2) From Eatons Crossing Rd (Yugar), turn <u>right</u> into Mt Samson Rd, continuing to Dayboro. Turn <u>right</u> at the pub (signs to Petrie & Mt Mee), then <u>left</u> at the swimming pool into Mt Mee Rd the showgrounds are approx 500 mtrs on your <u>left</u>

From the West – Follow Samford Rd to Samford & turn <u>right</u> at the roundabout into Main St (becomes Mt Samson Rd). Continue for approx 22 kms to Dayboro. * ...

From the South – Take the Gateway Motorway north, exiting onto Bruce Hwy. Cross the Pine River and take the very 1st exit <u>left</u> into Dohles Rocks Rd. Turn <u>left</u> into Anzac Ave (traffic lights). At the roundabout, turn <u>right</u> into Dayboro Rd, continuing to Dayboro. * ...

* ... From Dayboro Rd – turn <u>right</u> (just after the bridge) at the swimming pool into Mt Mee Rd – the showgrounds are approx 500 mtrs on your left.

- The Championship Hot Wheels/Matchbox style cars (no motor or spring); no modification whatsoever of the purchased as new vehicle is allowed.
- <u>Modified Vehicle</u> Vehicles with "after purchase" modifications, but no spring or motor may be used,
- Novelty Single units or combinations like car with caravan, semi-trailer, motor bike, and larger vehicles with approx. 3" wheel track to fit onto the track (no restriction in this class).

All vehicles will be scrutineered before racing and all winning vehicles will be scrutineered again.

The track will be available for practice runs throughout Saturday. Bring along a few vehicles to find out which is the best to run in the competition.

Please also bring all your motoring memorabilia, like flags, posters, trophies, books, etc, for display, and come along dressed in your finest racing garb.

There will be prizes for – First Placed Male (Sid Forster Trophy – First Placed Female (Speed Queen) – Best Dressed Female – Best Dressed Male – the Best Prang/Rollover– Best Dressed Driver and Team (maximum of 4 per team) and the first in each class – and there'll be other prizes too.


