At the top of the range turn <u>left</u> (continuing on Warrego Hwy – Cohoe St) and very shortly turn <u>right</u> into James St (still Warrego Hwy). Continue the length of James St.

At Clifford Gardens shopping centre (on your right), turn <u>left</u> into Anzac Ave (Gore Hwy); the signpost says "Millmerran/Goondiwindi". Continue on Gore Hwy for approx 40 kms; turn <u>left</u> where the signpost directs you to Pittsworth.

As you enter Pittsworth, the high school is on your <u>left</u>, followed by a street and then the showgrounds. Entry is at the far end of the showgrounds.

Faith Jones


We are sad to announce the passing of Faith Jones in March 2011. Faith and Doug Jones became members of QCC in 2003.

62 Years of History

As QCC's birthday is coming upon us, I thought I'd bring to you some pieces of QCC's history.

Firstly, it is interesting to reproduce a couple of extracts from the "Queensland Caravan Club Constitution and Rules 1960":

"Objects: To become a good social Club and encourage good friendship among all Caravanners and mobile home owners. To do any lawful thing as may be in the best interest of the club and its members."

"Membership Fees. The entrance fee shall be £1.10.6 (including pennant) and the Annual Subscription shall be £1.1.0."

QCC's first place in history was, of course, its very birth, in May 1949. This was not only important for QCC; it also brought a change to caravan life in Queensland as QCC was the very first caravan club in our state and, I believe, the second caravan club in Australia. The first rally of the Caravan Club of Australia, Brisbane Branch, as QCC was initially named, was held at Beachmere.

The next major milestone was some six years later in March 1955, when the club's name was changed to the Queensland Caravan Club. Caravan clubbing in Queensland was coming of age. And, of course, the name remains today.

In June 1962 the first edition of *The Wanderer* was produced, written by a member with the title "Editor & Publicity Officer". QCC's first Editor & Publicity Officer was Mervyn Lather. In the early days, and indeed not all that long ago, *The Wanderer* was produced by stencil, which was a long and very

messy process. Computers certainly have made life a wee bit easier for the Editor.

QCC has had two marquees in its lifetime. However, it was decided that a marquee big enough to comfortably cover all QCC's members and kitchen equipment, etc., would be too big for members to handle, and so in 2008 the second ("new") marquee was "sold" to a newly formed Queensland club, the Family Club.

In May 1949, club membership was 25 caravans. It took 49 years when in 1998 we had our 100th induction. Current membership is 107 and so we have not grown much in the last 13 years.

Originally, the men were members, the wives having "associate" status (there was a "Ladies Auxiliary"). However, the status of women changed within society, and also within the club, wives becoming members in their own right. The new century brought more change, and in the 2000 AGM women's status in QCC was cemented with the election of QCC's first (and only) lady President, Jacky Smith. We've since had single ladies as members.

December 1971/January 1972 heralded the first national caravan club rally in Australia, which was at No. 1 Oval in Mildura. The first national rally was attended by a number of representatives from the Queensland Caravan Club.

The first national caravan club rally in Queensland was some nine years later in December 1980/ January 1981, at Nambour. Queensland at that time of year means storms – and so the rally was flooded out. The next national rally in Queensland was at Cleveland – and at the same time of year – and it too was rained out. So far we've held only two national rallies in Queensland; the third one is coming up in September 2013 at Rockhampton, a far better time of year for Queensland.

The final memory I'll bring to you is QCC's 50th birthday in 1999. A marquee was set up at the site of the original rally, and current and old members came along to join in the celebrations.

In 2009 QCC travelled full circle when it made a reconnection back to the first rally in May 1949. This event was the induction of Neil and Marie Chesney as members. Neil was an 11 year old at our first rally in 1949 at Beachmere with his Mum and Dad, and his Dad served as Committee Man on the very first Committee.

I hope you enjoyed this journey through 62 years of history with me. And a happy 62nd birthday to Queensland Caravan Club members.
