

Caravan/Trailer Springs - "It happened to us. It can happen to you".

Our rear axle spring broke. That is serious enough by itself, but the damage it caused was traumatic. But it could have been worse as we could have written off the caravan and the car, as well as being injured ourselves.

What happened was – the rear spring main leaf broke and the axle, wheel and tyre on that side slid back and hit the van chassis and then twisted under the van. The rear axle ended up lengthwise under the van, with the wheels almost at right angles. This bent the 50mm square rear axle, tore the spring shackle on the other side of the van off the chassis – twisted the spring assembly – damaged the wheels and tore the tread off the wheels on that axle. For this to happen, the van must have leapt about a metre in the air.

On later inspection, we noted that the chassis has a C-shaped steel section immediately behind the rear tyres, ending in a bracket to allow use of a Trail-a-mate jack. This provides a sharp edge for the sliding tyre to catch, causing the worst of the trauma.

A partial solution to this problem would be to have the springs fitted with a military style wrap of the second spring leaf over the eye of the main leaf to hold the axle in place should the main leaf break, plus removal of .sharp c-shaped edge by inserting a smooth section of RHS channel into place

You should check this on your van before you plan your next big trip – we certainly are! From what we've read and from other members' experiences, this was not an unusual occurrence. Barry & Wendy Gibson.
