Rally at Allora Showgrounds- Aug 2012, How to get there.

(1) From Brisbane take the Ipswich Motorway. At Dinmore, turn <u>left</u> onto Cunningham Hwy towards Warwick. Continue past Aratula and up the very steep incline of Cunningham Gap. Approx 60 kms past Aratula, you'll come to the T-junction of New England Hwy. Turn <u>right</u> onto New England Hwy towards Toowoomba – it is 13 kms to Allora. Continue on the New England Hwy until you see a Freedom Service Station (on your left). Turn <u>left</u> just before the service station (into Darling St). The Allora showgrounds are on your left and the gate is approx 80 metres from the junction.

Alternative (in parts narrow, winding and hilly, but an easier ascent than through Cunningham Gap):

(2) Alternative – Take the Ipswich Motorway and turn off onto the Toowoomba bypass. At the Gatton bypass, exit the motorway and drive into Gatton (the old highway). Turn <u>left</u> at the 2nd traffic lights (signposted Clifton, Warwick). Continue on the old highway for about 6 kms and then turn <u>left</u>. Continue through Ma Ma Creek Village – please note that the road becomes narrow (down to 1 lane in one section), winding and hilly, but it is bitumen all the way and has a reasonable surface. Turn <u>left</u> at New England Hwy (signposted Clifton, Warwick). Allora is approx 13 kms past the turn. Continue on the New England Hwy until you see a Freedom Service Station (on your right). Turn <u>right</u> just after the service station (into Darling St). The Allora showgrounds are on your left and the gate is approx 80 metres from the junction.
