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	Boonah Showgrounds (9/06)	<u>Route 1</u> – From Brisbane, travel west on the Ipswich Motorway. At Dinmore, turn <u>left</u> onto the Cunningham Hwy towards Warwick and continue for 14 kms. Turn <u>left</u> onto the Ipswich-Boonah Rd and continue 40 kms to Boonah. <u>Route 2</u> – From Brisbane, proceed along Beaudesert Rd, which becomes Mt Lindesay Hwy, continuing past Park Ridge, Jimboomba and Gleneagle, until you arrive in Beaudesert. At Beaudesert, turn right at the main intersection in town (traffic lights) towards Rathdowney (still Mt Lindesay Hwy). At approx ½ km, turn <u>right</u> onto the Beaudesert- Boonah Rd and continue 42 kms to Boonah. <u>At Boonah</u> , both the above roads become Coronation Dve. With the park at the Boonah Sports Complex on your left, turn <u>left</u> at the roundabout and <u>left</u> again into Walter St (the park still on your left). Take the 1 st turn <u>left</u> into Cossart St, which leads to the showgrounds, opposite a caravan park.
