Blackbutt Showgrounds (1/12)	Either – Continue North on the Bruce Hwy north past the Buchanan Road/ Morayfield exit. At the next exit (Caboolture/Bribie Island/Kilcoy - Exit 152) there are 2 lanes that exit. Exit Bruce Hwy on the right exiting lane, which continues on to Kilcoy and D'Aguilar Hwy. Once on the road to Kilcoy and after going under the overhead bridge, move into the left lane, following the signs to Kilcoy. Follow the D'Aguilar Hwy through Wamuran, Woodford and Kilcoy, until you arrive at Blackbutt. Note – Blackbutt is approx 30 kms past the turnoff to Esk. **
	Or – From Ipswich Motorway, turn onto the Brisbane Valley Hwy. Continue through Esk and past the Toogoolawah turnoff. Turn left onto the D'Aguilar Hwy 17. Continue approx 30 kms until you arrive at Blackbutt. ** ** You will see a War Memorial statue at the end of the shops. Turn right at the statue into Hart St. The showgrounds is approx 500 metres on your right.

The Main Event tonight was Country Singer, Graham Roger.









