Rally at Hillview. How to Get There

From Brisbane, proceed along Beaudesert Rd, which becomes Mt Lindesay Hwy, continuing past Park Ridge, Jimboomba and Gleneagle, until you arrive in Beaudesert. (For people travelling from the Northside an alternative route is Gateway Bridge, Gateway MWY to /M1, down to Daisy Hill turnoff, onto Loganlea road. Follow to Bris/Beenleigh Rd. Turn left then right and follow signs to Logan village and along Tambourine road to right turn onto Beenleigh-Beaudesert Rd. At junction with Beaudesert road turn left and follow instructions below)

At Beaudesert, turn right at the main intersection in town (traffic lights) towards Rathdowney (still Mt Lindesay Hwy). Continue towards Rathdowney At Laravale (approximately 14 kms from the turn), keep straight on towards Hillview on Christmas Creek Rd .Continue for approximately 17 kms – caution – the road narrows. At Hillview, veer left at the Y junction. The Hillview Hall is right in front of you as you reach the Y junction. The Hillview Hall grounds entry is immediately on your right. Slow down as you prepare to enter the grounds before you reach the Hall.
