Exit <u>left</u> (veering right over the motorway) onto the Warrego Hwy A2 in the direction of Toowoomba.</p> <p>Follow the Warrego Hwy for approx 45 kms to Plainlands and at the hotel turn <u>left</u> to Laidley.</p> <p>Continue 8 kms to Laidley, continuing through. At the T-junction just past town, turn <u>right</u> (Mulgowie Rd) and follow the signs to Mulgowie (approx 7 kms).</p> <p>At the Mulgowie Hotel, turn <u>right</u> across a bridge and then almost immediately turn left into the sportsground.</p>
