Turn right here and follow till you reach the railway line. On crossing rail track, turn immediately left into weaver street, then left again at Bruce Road (NOT Mill road). Proceed down Bruce Road to caravan park at next intersection.










One of the Stall holders led a Tag-along tour of the local district, giving a very interesting history lesson.
