A Walk Down Memory Lane

Did you know that 2017 is the 40th anniversary of the inaugural State Rally (or "Combined Caravan Club Rally" as they were originally called)? The 40th anniversary actually was last year, but Queensland did not have a State Rally in 2016 because we had the Canberra National Rally instead and so the 40th anniversary is this year – confusing, hey?

It was 1976 when the Chesney Caravan Club invited QCC, the Sunshine Caravan Club and the Kookaburra Caravan Club to attend the inaugural State Rally. *The Wanderer* of July 1976 invited QCC members to come along to the Esk Caravan Park on 4th and 5th September 1976 (yes, it was over a weekend). A total of 45 caravans rolled up for this inaugural rally, including some 21 vans from QCC. Included in QCC's contingent was Peggy Finlayson (current Life Member), who attended with her late husband Mal. Although no other current member attended, Ron Petch's Mum and Dad were part of QCC's contingent.

Early Combined Club Rallies were over a two day weekend, hosted by individual clubs rotationally.

The following is an extract from *The Wanderer* of October 1976:

"CARAVAN INVASION

This was the heading of an article in the Qld. Times after the combined Clubs Rally to Esk on the 4/5 September. A few of the reports filtering back were: - Eric Bycroft won a MCC. Dorothy Guttormsen slipped the latch on the caravan door on the outside door. They all went to visit an orchid, locking poor old Ron inside. Lucky for him John Rogers had stayed behind and let him out. John's car had been giving him a little radiator problem. Master Kirkman ran into a barbed wire fence and gave himself some nasty cuts to the face and neck."
