

THE 40th STATE RALLY **NEWS**

Are we there yet? No not quite, but the 40th State Rally at Goondiwindi is getting real close. There's still some work to be done and more volunteers required.

The CCQ Committee and many of the Rally Coordinators met at the Easts Leagues Club on Monday 31st July to hear from the committee and the coordinators what progress each had made towards their respective areas of activity and to hear of any concerns they may have had. As an example there will many volunteers needed on Monday morning for 'Meet & Greet' at the entry gate and marshalling for parking caravans.

Volunteers needed before Monday will be contacted by the respective coordinators.

Entry to the showground before Monday 18th of September is by invitation only.

Each coordinator will issue a letter on invitation to those who are needed early. Camping fees of \$20.00 per night over and above the rally fees. The Bump-in Registration form must be completed and the fees paid to the Registrar before entry to the showground.

Pat Mander will be coordinating the 'Meet & Greet' while Keith Lofgren is the Rally Marshal. You may contact them through the CCQ Secretary. The rally newsletter editor, Barry Roberts, will also need volunteers to deliver the daily newsletter to each caravan during the rally. The main hall is the McColl Pavilion and coordinator Barry Steinhardt, will also need volunteers for the flag raising during the Opening Ceremony and for the layout of the hall, moving chairs and setting up tables for dinner on Friday evening etc.

MONDAY 18th

ENTRY GATE OPENS AT 8AM. NOT BEFORE.

The gate will be open from 8am - 12 noon and then from 1pm - 4pm.

Entry is via the **Old Cunningham Highway** which gives sufficient room for some caravans to be parked off the main Leichardt Highway. Please DO NOT PARK OR QUEUE on the Leichardt Highway. The Leichardt Highway is a extremely busy heavy transport route so care is required when entering and exiting the showground.

The main showground gate as shown on the map will be the entry and exit gate from Tuesday onwards.


Please bring your club flag or banner to the rally Office when you come to register. It will be needed so the hall coordinator can organise it for display at the Opening Ceremony.


for the 40th Caravan Club's State Rally Disc Bowls Pairs Championship!

RALLY RULES

ALCOHOL: Consumption of alcohol is restricted to caravans, designated happy hour areas and the main hall.

BLACK WATER: Toilet cassettes and night buckets are to be emptied into the approved Dump Point only, NOT the toilets.

GREY WATER: A stocking must be placed over the end of sullage hoses to catch all solids. Please BYO sullage bucket for the collection of sullage water.

PETS: Pets must be confined in an enclosed area or restrained on a leash of 2 metres or less. Pets are not allowed in buildings, marquees or eating areas. Owners are responsible for the behaviour of their pets and must clean up any "mess" deposited by their pets.

SMOKING: Smoking is not allowed in buildings, marquees, eating areas or any communal gathering area.

SELF DRIVE TOURS AND SIGHT - SEEING

GOONDIWINDI BOTANIC GARDEN

If you're after rest and relaxation, enjoy the tranquillity of the local Botanical Gardens while exploring the diversity of bird life and Australia's native flora and fauna in these 25-hectare gardens.

Situated on the western outskirts of Goondiwindi, the gardens are home to a living museum of the unique plant communities to the Upper Darling Basin. Native plants in the gardens are displayed in communities merging into



SCULPTURES



These three large sandstone sculptures, are known as the Goondiwindi Pillars. Artist, Chris Mackenzie, designed and sculpted the pieces in 2001 as part of a Centenary of Federation Project in Goondiwindi.

The design focuses on images of water birds and stylised depictions of water and rain. It captures the relationship between the Macintyre River and the township of Goondiwindi: "water is life".

Located in McLean Street Goondiwindi (near the old McIntyre Bridge Crossing) the pillars are a much loved element of the townscape and are a focal point of the Border Heritage Precinct.

This public art was commissioned in response to the devastating 2011 Floods. The sculpture was influenced by the abundance of water birds that appear following the floods. Reflecting the image of a phoenix; the universal symbol of renewal, it represents the Texas community's ability to overcome adversity.

The project was funded by Queensland and Australian Governments under the Natural Disaster Relief and Recovery Arrangements (NDRRA) Flexible Funding Program. This beautiful art piece is located in High Street Texas (in the CBD area). It is called the Spirit of Texas

OTHER PLACES TO VISIT

Australia Map Sculpture – Located on private property it was created by local artist Angus Wilson. Made totally of steel it is located across from the airport .

Macintyre River – fantastic mighty river that acts as the divider for the two states of QLD and NSW, also great for a spot of fishing which access points throughout the region .

Goondiwindi Botanic Garden – 25ha of outdoor native gardens, stroll around the garden on the walking track or take your kayak for a paddle in the lagoon.

The Goondiwindi Natural Heritage & Water Park is situated to the east of Goondiwindi Town. To get there take the Kildonan Road exit off the Cunningham/Newell Highway roundabout and turn the first left into Johnson Road. The entrance is through the gates further up the road on the right.

Lake Coolmunda: Water sports, fishing, bird watching, hiking, perfect sunrises and sunsets, camping and cabins. At Lake Coolmunda you'll find everything you need to escape, relax and enjoy life for a few days. Use of the Lake is open to all and accessible via a boat ramp, and the banks are a perfect place to pull up for a picnic lunch. Campers can choose from low-cost water front options with amenities, or the Lake Coolmunda Caravan Park and Cabins which include amenities, powered sites, swimming pool, tennis court, BBQ, Camp Oven and camp kitchen.
