QCC's 69th Birthday in 2018

ell, this May it's QCC's 69th birthday. Queensland Caravan Club Inc (or Caravan Club of Australia, Brisbane Branch, as it was originally) was born in May 1949, and that's a long time ago.

But, thinking about it, 50 years ago in 1968, 19 years after the club was formed – I wonder how it was then? How times have changed – in recent years we've had a few single women as members, and our first (and only) female president was Jacky Smith in 2000-01. These days, the average age of members is much higher than it was in 1968. In 1968 the club was very family oriented, but lately we see lots of grandparents at rallies, with their grandchildren or even great grandchildren visiting.

The 1968 birthday rally was held on 18th and 19th May at the Beenleigh Showground. According to the rally report in The Wanderer of June 1968, there were 22 vans in attendance; I think it's been a long time since we've had only 22 vans at a rally! And the night's entertainment of games, dancing and community singing was very well received.

During 1968, the number of vans at the rallies, including visitors, averaged at 20 vans. The smallest rally for the year was attended by 8 vans in January at Suffolk Park in NSW, and 29 (plus 11 cars) for the December Christmas rally at the Beenleigh Showground was the largest.

At the May committee meeting (all men of course), it was agreed to make M Verrell an 'honorary member' as he was a founding member and his ill health over the previous 10 years had made him unable to attend rallies, even though he was still financial. I can only assume QCC did not have social or associate members in 1968, as they were concerned about setting a precedent.

I should mention that, in June 1968, the committee approved Ron and Pam Robson-Petch as members. Ron and Pam are, of course, life members today and were inducted as members at the July 1968 rally – yep, they have been

members for fifty years this year! Now that's a long time to be members. I wonder what the record for length of membership is? Happy 69th birthday!

Next Rally ~ Pine Rivers Showground 5/6 May. How to get there

<u>From the south</u> – take the Gateway Motorway, continuing past the Depot Road and Brackenridge and Redcliffe exits. After the Gateway Motorway veers left from the Redcliffe exit, take the next exit (signed 'Brackenridge Road/Strathpine'). At the end of the ramp, turn right into Brackenridge Road and continue on until it becomes Hoyland Street, then Strathpine Road after it passes over Gympie Arterial Road and eventually becomes Gympie Road.

Continue along Gympie Road through Strathpine, past Westfield Shoppingtown, Bunnings and Supercheap (right). Turn into the showgrounds entrance and follow the club signs.

<u>From the north</u> – travel south along the Bruce Highway and take Exit 133 to Anzac Avenue. At the traffic lights, turn right onto Anzac Avenue and follow it through into Kallangur. Follow Anzac Avenue through to the roundabout at Petrie and take the 1st turn left into Gympie Road. Follow Gympie Road into Lawnton, and after the 2nd traffic lights (at Lawnton Pocket Road), turn left into the showgrounds.

It was while driving coaches on the Rockhampton to Brisbane run that he met a young graduate teacher, Olive Audsley. Marrying on New Year's Day, 1977, Noel and Olive began married life living in a 23ft Viscount Supreme caravan which they bought from Barry Gall (later of Kedron Caravans) then to a house in Bracken Ridge, then five acres at Bellmere until now, 40 acres at Delaneys Creek. Together they had two children, a daughter, Lisa, a champion equestrian rider, and a son, Greg, who they sadly lost in a road accident when he was 19.

Noel's work career saw him move between coach driving for Skennars, McCaffertys, Deluxe Coachlines, Bus Australia and Greyhound, with stints back driving trucks for his parents and later for a variety of trucking companies until his retirement in January, 2015. Olive saw 43 and a half years' service with Education Queensland, 25 years of which were at the Woodford P-10 State School before retiring from full-time teaching in July of 2016. Casual teaching now allows her to keep in touch with the children and the grandchildren of her past students.

Finally, I arrived but an hour late and saw that the service was over, the funeral director had departed and the hearse was nowhere in sight. Only the crew were left and they were eating lunch. I felt very badly and apologised to the men for being late.



I went to the side of the grave and looked down at the vault. I didn't know what to do, so I started to play. The workers put down their lunches and began to gather around. I played-out my heart-and-soul for this man whom I didn't know and with no family and no friends. I played like I had never played before for this poor homeless and familyless man.

And as I played Amazing Grace, the workers began to weep. They wept, I wept; we all wept together. When I had finished playing, I packed-up my bagpipes and proceeded to my car. Though my head was hung low, my heart was full. As I opened the door to my car, I heard one of the workers say, "I never seen anything like that before, and I've been putting-in septic tanks for over twenty years."

Friday 4th May, 1:30pm. Denise Park will demonstrate how to do printing onto fabric. The picture below shows a collection of leaves and feathers, etc., collected from travels around Australia printed onto calico to make a table cloth. Anyone wanting to do some printing please bring the following items to complete your project.

- \Rightarrow Ink for fabric. I use blue, red and yellow as these seem to mix with any colour.
- ⇒ Old newspaper to protect your work area
- ⇒ Assorted leaves, flowers, feathers, etc., that you would like to print onto your fabric.
- ⇒ Suitable piece of calico or similar that you want to print onto. Size depends on what you want to make. A meter would make a small table cloth.
- \Rightarrow Laundry marker pen.
- ⇒ Roller if you have one or a rolling pin would do.
- ⇒ Smallish paint brush to put fabric ink onto leaves.
- ⇒ Container for water and rags for clean-up.
