
### Vice President's Report ...

Fees: Per van, per night. \$32.00. Powered. A little about Bundaberg ... Bundaberg is a city near the south-east coast of Queensland and situated on the Burnett

River. It is the business centre for a major sugar cane growing area, and is well known for its namesake export, Bundaberg Rum. The city is an important tourism gateway for inland national parks and the southern end of the Great Barrier Reef and resort islands. At the 2016 Census population of the Bundaberg Significant Urban Area was 69,061. The first Europeans in the area were timbergetters and co-founders of Bundaberg, John and Gavin Steuart, who arrived in 1867. The town was surveyed in 1870, and in 1881, it was gazetted as a municipality (the Borough of Bundaberg). It grew rapidly into a town by 1902 and a city by 1913. The name 'Bundaberg' was coined by surveyor John Charlton Thompson, based on the name given by local Aborigi-



nals; 'bunda' or 'chief', and the German suffix 'berg', meaning 'hill'. Colloquially the city is known as 'Bundy'.

were inspected. With these results, can we expect to see Department of Transport inspectors beside the highway soon? Here are some staggering results ....

- ♦ 51% of the vans weighed were over their ATM.
- 24% of tow vehicles weighed were over their GVM.
- 8% of tow vehicles weighed were over their GCM.
- Highest reading over-weight single-axle caravan, 618kg.
- Highest reading over-weight tandem-axle caravan, 485kg.
- Highest reading over-weight tow vehicle, 215kg.
- Highest reading tow ball mass 405kg on a caravan with an ATM of 3350kg.

It's a list of nationwide locations of public toilets and their time of operation. The site is easy to use, and by adding your starting point and destination, it outlines a map of a route and highlighting the locations of toilets along the way. As a trial, Patrick entered a start point of Brisbane and a destination of Bundaberg, and sure enough, roads were identi-

fied and how to get there as well as showing toilets along the way. It does use a lot of freebie sites but having locations in towns and villages is helpful. Match it to your GPS and you will not get caught short, or caught with your pants up. so-to-speak.




