A little about 'Kenilworth' ... Kenilworth is located on the edge of the

Conondale National Park, 139 km north of Brisbane via the Bruce Highway. It is one of those charming rural towns where chic coffee shops and cafes; the opportunity to buy excellent cheeses from the Kenilworth Country Food and Cheese Factory; the delightful rolling hills of the Conondale and Blackall Ranges; and excellent bush walking, gem fossicking and fishing in the creeks for bass, perch, cod and mullet; all combine to give the town and district an ambience which is both fashionable, environmentally-sensitive and rustic.

<u>Origin of Name</u> ... the Scottish influence in this area of Queensland is pervasive. Kenilworth was named after a novel of the same name written by Sir Walter Scott. Apparently a grazier named Richard Smith was running cattle on the banks of the Mary River and at the time his wife was reading Kenilworth. Hence the name of the property which became the name of the town.



<u>Things to See and Do</u> ... Kenilworth Country Food and Cheese Factory. A near-perfect example of the initiative of a small community, the Kenilworth Country Food and Cheese Factory was established by the Kraft Corporation in 1950 to produce bulk cheese which was sent to the Kraft factory in Victoria. In 1989 Kraft decided to close the factory but two workers, Colin Cunningham and Clem Hassell, decided that it was still viable and managed to persuade people that it should be bought from Kraft. The result is a fine, boutique cheese making factory in the heart of Queensland's dairy district. The specialities are Roma Malling and Malling Red which were created in the early twentieth century by a Darling Downs master cheese maker known affectionately as 'Poppa' Hansen. They are a rarity.

History ... Prior to the arrival of Europeans, the Mary River region was inhabited by the Butchulla aboriginal people who called the river Moonaboola or Numabulla. In 1847, the Governor of Queensland, Governor Fitzroy, named the river after his wife, Mary. The first Europeans into the area arrived in the 1850s and the Kenilworth homestead was built in 1865 as the main residence on the large Obi Obi pastoral run. By the 1890s, the area was predominantly dairy farming. The settlers had hoped it would be good for small crops which could be sold to the gold miners at Gympie but the frequency of floods led them to turn to dairy and cattle. A Kenilworth Farmers Association was formed in 1902 and produce was sent to the Caboolture Butter Factory (built 1907) for processing. The township was surveyed in 1921 and the larger properties were subdivided. A butcher's shop was established in 1924 and the local hall, built in the same year, was showing silent movies by 1926. In 1952 Kraft opened a dairy factory which continued to operate until 1989 when it was taken over by a local cooperative.

## Casserole / Pie Carrier

What you will need:

- ⇒ 2 x 21" squares of either same fabric or one each of main and contrast.
- $\Rightarrow$  1 x 5" x 22" of main colour for handle.
- $\Rightarrow$  4 x 1.5" x 7" for loops or 2 x 'D' rings.

Note. A 21" square will fit a 12" to 14" dish for a lager or oblong dish.

You need a 26" square and you will require 27" length for the handles

Wadding will be supplied. Don't forget your sewing machine, matching or contrast thread, scissors and pins.

#### Member Profile ~ Bob and Barbara Rutherford ....



ob and Barbara Rutherford are Brisbane born and bred, Bob being brought-up in Holland Park and Barbara in Rosalie. They met in April 1968 and were married in October 1970. Bob Is the end of the family line as they had two girls who have given them five grandchildren.

Bob began his working life at age 14 taking-up an apprenticeship as a pastry chef and working in different bakeries and cake shops around Brisbane until 1988 when his application for the catering licence for the Kedron Park Campus of QUT was successful. Barbara gave-up her job at that time to help with the business and they both look back on those four years as the busiest of their life but yet the most rewarding in many ways. The amalgamation of the four

campuses under one umbrella meant the catering licence was renegotiated for one management company to take on all four so they hung up their aprons at the end of 1991.

Soon after that, Bob bought a Couriers Please business and when it became too big to handle, he split it up into several 'runs' and sold them off which enabled him to eventually pick-up a bit of part time work as a storeman and eventually retire at age 58 in 2002.

After finishing high school, Barbara started clerical work at the Queensland State Archives in William Street, later relocating to Dutton Park beside Boggo Road Jail. She left there in 1970 to be married (archaic laws prevented married women in the public service back then). However, she was soon back at work again at General Credits Finance. After a break of 12 years to raise the children, Barbara took-up a position in the QUT Library, working on several campuses (with a break to help in the Kedron Park Refectory with Bob as above) until eventually becoming secretary to the campus librarian at Kelvin Grove. She, too, retired in 2002 and they moved out to Kobble Creek (Samsonvale) for their tree break. But ... then grandchildren started to come along so they moved back into Carseldine to be near them.

Their retirement has been spent travelling extensively overseas and in Australia. Bob spends his spare time brewing his beer and tinkering in his shed while Barbara keeps the meals up to him and working in her office.

Caravanning has been a big part of their life. Bob owned a couple of caravans when they first met. He rented them out as onsite vans when he worked in Bundaberg – one even had a bath tub under the front seat of the van! Their first rally was in November 1978 at Kirkleigh and they were made members in February 1979. The Club was so different in those times – most had children and the older members were their adoptive grandparents. Entertainment was simple but loads of fun and we all dressed up in our long skirts to come over to the marquee on Saturday nights.

Bob and Barbara held many positions on the Club Committee over the years and were very proud to be granted Life Membership in 2007. They very rarely miss a rally and look forward to many more to come as they continue to enjoy the Fellowship on Wheels offered by the members of the Queensland Caravan Club.




