A little about Lowood Lowood township is located in the Somerset Region approximately 13 kilometres west of Fernvale, is approximately 66 kilometres west of Brisbane and has a population of about 3,500. Lowood was established as the first terminus of the Brisbane Valley Branch Railway in 1884 and a railhead for local sawmilling. As timber was cleared the land was turned over to dairying, and a butter factory was opened in 1903. The town grew from the subdivision around the new station. The name is derived from the 'low woods' of brigalow in the Lowood area, as opposed to the taller trees elsewhere in the Brisbane Valley. Lowood Post Office opened on 15 October 1888 although a receiving office had been open from 1884.

In 1941, a military airfield called Lowood, which was actually

located at Mount Tarampa, was established and operated by the Royal Australian Air Force. No 71 Squadron operated from the airfield during 1943 conducting coastal patrol and naval convoy escort missions. The RAAF Station was also used for elementary flying training and also by USAAF fighter squadrons (1942) before becoming a RAAF operational base (OB) for dive bombers.

After the war the airfield was converted into a motor racing circuit, known as the 'Lowood Airfield Circuit', and operated for 20 years, the highlight was the hosting of the 1960 Australian Grand Prix. The airfield no longer exists but a small memorial marks its previous location. The area is now residential with the main runway redeveloped and named Daisy Road.

The railway line was closed in 1993. Lowood has a local shopping centre, swimming, bowls and golf venues, a sports and recreation centre, a showground, a local growers' packing house and the residence of the most notable and esteemed George and Yvonne Lacey.

Member Profile ~ Mary and Rodney Metcalfe

The Lives and Times of Rodney and Mary Metcalfe

odney and Mary joined the Queensland Caravan Club in 2013 after fifteen years of tent and camper trailer journeys with the Mitsubishi 4WD Owners' Club of Queensland Inc. In June 2010 Rod chaired the Australian 4WD 8th National Gathering at Pomona, and who should he have to liaise with, but none other than QCC Secretary, Gwen Egan. That Club conducted a rally there in the days beforehand. Now the Metcalfes, too, wear the familiar yellow shirts as a result of that contact.

Rod's place of birth was Newcastle, NSW. Mary, born in Dalby where her father was a stock and station agent, is the same age as the QCC. In 1963, Eric Caton constructed privately-owned saleyards in Toowoomba, so her secondary schooling was completed at that city's



state high school. Rod and Mary's paths coincided in Toowoomba around 1969. Rod, an old boy of Rangeville State School and Toowoomba Grammar School was a solicitor in training. Mary worked as a shorthand conference reporter for the Queensland Graingrowers' Association. Weekends were enjoyed as members of the Young Anglican Fellowship. Their marriage in November 1970 was just one of twelve couples originating from this group.

Life took a different turn in May 1970 when Rod joined the RAAF Legal Service after being admitted to practise as a solicitor in February 1970. His marble had earlier been drawn out of the barrel for national service call-up. How many young people get asked to marry earlier than planned because their employer wants to post them overseas, but will not say where?

Penang and Butterworth became home for two years from 1971-73, followed by a year in Canberra, still engaged in RAAF duties. Mary worked in the Australian Honours and Awards Section at that time. When an opening became available within the City Solicitor's Office of Brisbane City Council in 1974, the couple were elated that Rod was offered the position. Twenty years of BCC service ensued, 10 years as a lawyer and 10 years in management roles, during which time their family of two boys and a girl arrived. Mary became the household manager and an unpaid community mother on many committee executives, the usual swimming and soccer clubs, scouts, guides and Duke of Edinburgh Award running daily a Mum's Taxi. Rod's role involved interesting projects as a council representative, e.g., opening of the Southbank Centre, Queen Street Mall, Olympic Games bids by Brisbane, (including two trips to East Berlin before the Wall was demolished), Warana Board, and World Master Games Board when held in Brisbane. In early years with BCC he made many a court appearance on behalf of the Council. From 1994, a stint followed in the Department of Tourism and Sport seeking commercial and sporting opportunities for Queensland in the years leading up to the Sydney Olympic Games.

His legal career in local government saw him appointed in 1995 as Deputy State Ombudsman, with responsibility for local government matters. While officially retiring in December 2006, Rod has seen service as a Member of both the Health Quality Complaints Commission and more recently the Local Government Misconduct Tribunal.

From May 1998 for recreation, the pair had joined the Mitsubishi Club and are still current members. Convoy tenting trips to Cape York, down the Birdsville Track, Flinders Ranges and other exciting bush venues followed. On one such trip in 2004, while engaged in a reconnoitre of a weekend trip they planned to run, Mary discovered a gravestone bearing her own name in the Leyburn Cemetery. Indeed, who was that woman? There began for her a passionate hobby in the hunt for the Caton family of which she knew little. The lady in question proved to be her great grandmother, and alongside her was the great grandfather descended from an Irish Famine Orphan who arrived in Australia in 1849. Never

in her wildest dreams did Mary ever think that her research would be accepted on screen by the 'Who Do You Think You Are' team which prepared Michael Caton's story in 2013. Michael and Mary both share that Irish famine orphan as direct descendants. For eighteen months, she was sworn to secrecy about the program, particularly after the filming, and had a hard time keeping Rod quiet on the subject when he had imbibed a red or two!! Even our children were not told. Since then Mary has become a family history writer having articles published in several family history society journals when time permits, and when she and Rod are not off camping. The bush girl within holds a strong pull. Writing narrative poetry is another of her pastimes.

The Metcalfes enjoy being members of the QCC family and lending support to country towns during rallies. They take this opportunity to acknowledge the substantial ongoing behind-the-scenes work each month that results in pleasant gatherings for so many of us. 'Volunteers on wheels' surely leads to 'fellowship on wheels'.

Craft Project for the February Lowood Rally 'Drink Bottle Cover'

Material Requirements:

Main Cover.

- \Rightarrow Cut a rectangle 1 linches high x 13 inches high.
- ⇒ Cut a 6 inch square for the base, this is then cut into a circle after it has been quilted.
- \Rightarrow Cut 2 x 1½ inch x 21 inch for the ties.
- \Rightarrow Cut 2 x 5 inch x 3 inch for the ties casting.

Lining.

- \Rightarrow Cut a rectangle 14 inches x 13 inches.
- \Rightarrow Cut a 6 inch square for the base.

<u>Insulbrite Batting.</u> (30cm available at any patchwork shop or from Spotlight).

⇒ Cut II inch xI3 inch and a base circle 5 inch square.




