 Arrive no earlier than 12 midday Wednesday 6th March and leave no later than 10:00am Tuesday 12th March.

How to get there From Brisbane South: Follow the Ipswich Motorway to the Cunningham and Warrego Highway Interchange. Exit left (passing over the motorway) onto the Warrego Highway towards Toowoomba. Follow the Warrego Highway for approximately 45 km to Plainlands, and at the hotel, turn left onto the Laidley/Plainlands Road to Laidley. Continue through Laidley and turn right at the T-intersection onto Mulgowie Road and follow to Mulgowie (approximately seven km). At the Mulgowie Hotel, turn right into Beckman Road, cross a bridge and then almost immediately turn left into the sportsground.

From the North Side: – Follow the M1 to the Bribie Island Interchange and take the D'Aguiar Highway exit. Approximately 26 kilometres past Kilcoy, turn left onto the Brisbane Valley Highway and follow to Esk. From Esk, take the Gatton-Esk Road to the Warrego Highway and turn left to Plainlands. Directions as per above.

A Little about Mulgowie Mulgowie is a farming community in the Lockyer Valley. The locality is named after Mount Mulgowie, which in turn, has an Aboriginal name meaning 'big round hill'. Apart from a sports-ground and a hotel, there is little else commercially in Mulgowie. The region, is however, rich in farming, and boasts production of some of the best small crops in the country. The most commonly grown crops are carrots, potatoes, brassica vegetables (eg., cabbage, broccoli, cauliflower), pumpkins, corns and beans. These are just some of the vegetables which are shipped-out to markets all over Australia and overseas.



Exotic vegetables such as okra, snake beans, baby fennel, figs and broccolini are highly sought after by keen chefs.

While driving through the Lockyer Valley, it is highly likely that you will see farms and crops where these vegetables are grown. You may even purchase vegetables from a road side stall or select them fresh from the market!

The scale of innovative agriculture can be seen in some of the large family-owned enterprises around Mulgowie such as Mulgowie Farming Company which supplies high quality green beans and sweet corn, which outshone multinationals to be named Woolworths Supplier of the Year in 2002. The Mulgowie Farming Company machinery manufacturing and sales sector is second-to-none with some businesses the largest of their kind in the country and is a leading supplier of small crop and haymaking machinery.

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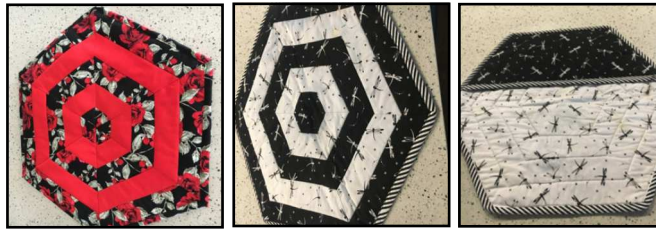
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Craft Project for the March Mulgowie Rally 'Steering Wheel Cover and Car Tidy'



Material Requirements:

Steering Wheel Cover.

- ⇒ Qty 5 X 2.5 inch strips of fabric. Width of fabric to be at least 44 inches.
- ⇒ Qty 1 X 24 inch square.
- ⇒ Qty 2 X 8 inch X 20 inch rectangles.

Binding.

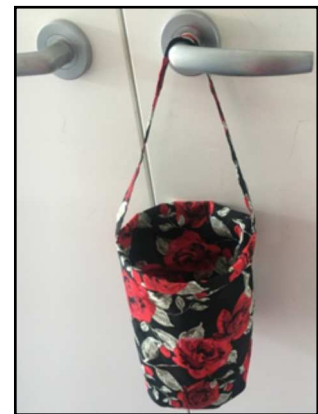
- ⇒ Approximately 2.5m straight-cut bias binding would be fine, eg., 2.5 inches wide x 2.5 m.
- ⇒ Cut a 6 inch square for the base.

Insulbrite Batting.

- ⇒ 1 m cut a 24"inch square and (one) 1 8 inch x 20 . Available at spotlight or a patchwork shop. Please let Yvonne know if you can't get any.

Car Tidy.

- ⇒ Qty 2 9 inch X 18 inch rectangles.
- ⇒ Qty 2 ½ inch X 20 inch for the handles.
- ⇒ Qty 2 7" Inch squares
- ⇒ Qty 1 7" square of insulbrite.
- ⇒ 50cm Rigiband, ½ inch wide. Available from Spotlight.



All seams ¼ inch. If you have a walking foot, you will also need that. No problems if you don't.

- ⇒ Cottons to match fabric

N.B. Sew the five pieces together before class please and join the five x 2 1/2 inch strips together along the length. Press all seams allowance in the same direction. If you have a 60 degree triangle bring it with you. Yvonne will have hers.

Lay out the triangles: In a pleasing manner to form a hexagon shape,

Sew two triangles together, butting the seams together as you go. Sew a third triangle onto this pair. Repeat this step with the remaining three triangles. Press and sew the two halves of the hexagon together.

Lay the hexagon on top of the 24inch square fabric, right side out, and base the three layers together either with a spray of or pin.

Quilt-in the ditch around the hexagon shape. This is where the walking foot will make it much easier, but don't stress if you don't have one.

To make the back flap, sandwich the strip of 8 x20 inch insulbrite between the two 8 x 20 inch rectangles of fabric right side out. Run a strip of binding along the bottom, this is then placed at the back of the hexagon cut to shape.

Join the binding iron in half length ways then sew this around the hexagon including the back flap

The car tidy will only take about 15 minutes to make.

It's about time the authorities did something about older drivers on our roads.

For far too long, older drivers have caused havoc and chaos on our roads as they continually hog the left lane, stick to the speed limits (even road work limits) and stop at stop signs which causes great inconvenience and often preventing others from doing whatever they like.

Another major concern is that by avoiding fines and demerit points, they are not doing their bit for the revenue of our state, and therefore placing a further burden on younger drivers, particularly p-platers.

Until older drivers can prove that they are proficient at weaving in-and-out of traffic, road-rage, texting and eating Big Macs while driving, tailgating, using drugs or doing donuts and burnouts, they must be banned from holding a drivers' licence and from driving on our roads.
