<u>A Little about Beaudesert ...</u> Beaudesert is located on the Mount Lindesay Highway, 69 kilometres south of Brisbane. Known for its showgrounds, Beaudesert is the gateway to the Scenic Rim's spectacular scenery. The area sources its income predominantly from rural activities such as cropping, grazing and equine activities, as well as tourism.

The town was settled in 1847 and has grown to a small, bustling centre. The origins of Beaudesert's name have been the subject of debate for many years. It is possibly named after Beau Desert Park, the property of Charles Henry Alexander Paget of Staffordshire, England. Yet it is certain that Queensland's Beaudesert was

named in about 1841 or 1842 by 'Ned Hawkins', or Edward Brace Hawkins (1821-1849), who was claiming the area as a sheep station on behalf of his employer William Henry Suttor senior (1805-1877) at Bathurst. It is not known why Hawkins picked the name Beaudesert.

The town was originally set-out in a grid pattern, however, several of the streets followed cart tracks. The area was originally settled for growing cotton and sheep, however, the area is also notoriously short of water and cotton was not a successful crop. Hoop pine was very successfully collected from the area. In 1863, cotton workers were indentured labourers from the south sea islands, the first such use in Queensland. In the 1880s, Cobb & Co stagecoaches ran between Beaudesert and Jimboomba. And, in 1885, the Beaudesert railway line commenced being pegged-out and the railway was opened in 1888. Timber, cattle and dairying were the main industries in the area.



The Beaudesert Shire Tramway to Christmas Creek, Lamington and Rathdowney, operated by the Beaudesert Shire, opened in 1903 and closed in 1944. A local newspaper, the Beaudesert Times was established in 1908.

The population of Beaudesert is approximately 6,500.




From Ann and Patrick Hetherman - a very sad notation to the QCC Wanderer.

An Introduction to 'Rear Marking Plates' and

'DO NOT OVERTAKE TURNING VEHICLE' Signage

Authority: Department of Infrastructure and Regional Development

(Vehicle Standards Bulletin 12) National Code of Practice



Rear Marking Plates. MUST be fitted to:

- All vehicles with a gross vehicle mass over 12 tonnes.
- Trailers with a gross trailer mass over 10 tonnes.
- This requirement applies to:
 - Trailers which are hauled by trucks.
 - Prime movers with a gross combination mass of over 12 tonnes.
 - Buses with a gross vehicle mass over 12 tonnes.

Rear Marking Plates. May be fitted to:

- Any motor vehicle with less than 12 tonnes gross vehicle mass.
- Any trailer with less than 10 tonnes gross trailer mass

DO NOT OVERTAKE TURNING VEHICLE Sign. MUST be fitted to:

DO NOT OVERTAKE TURNING VEHICLE

31L Decal 300mm x 100mm Vehicles or combinations with a combined length of 7.5 metres or more <u>that have to straddle lanes or turn from an adjacent lane in</u> <u>order to turn left or right at an intersection.</u>

DO NOT OVERTAKE TURNING VEHICLE Sign. MUST NOT be fitted to:

• Vehicles or combinations with a combined length of less than 7.5 metres.

Displaying the 'DO NOT OVERTAKE TURNING VEHICLE' gives the driver a special turning concession. The sign is, however, not compulsory, but not displaying the sign and straddling lanes in order to turn is illegal.

Once fitted, the sign will enable the driver to use multiple lanes at roundabouts or when turning. But remember that other drivers are often prepared for trucks to use multiple lanes when turning and may not necessarily be prepared for caravans doing these manoeuvres. So whenever using multiple lanes to conduct a turn, exercise caution and be vigilant of other drivers.

Positioning of the DO NOT OVERTAKE TURNING VEHICLE sign:

- No higher than 2000mm from the ground.
- No lower than 400mm from the ground.
- No further from the left of the vehicle than 500mm.







A Bit of Trivia. Why do we drive on the left side of the road in Australia?



riving on the left-hand side of the road in Australia is based on the traditions of the English. During the Middle Ages, people travelled on the left side of the road for protection. If a stranger was coming along from the opposite direction or was passing you, it was important to keep your sword handy in your right hand in case the stranger turned out to be a

villain and you were attacked. Too bad it you were left-handed!! In A.D. 1300, Pope Boniface VIII mandated that all pilgrims going to Rome had to travel on the left side of the road.

Right-Hand Side. Over 400 years later in France, farmers hauling their products to town in large wagons usually rode on the horses rather than in the wagon. The farmer sat on the horse that was on the left and at the back of the team, thereby keeping his right arm free to whip the team if needed. Sitting on the left also made it easier to look down and make sure the wagon wheels didn't hit those of other passing wagons. In this way, people started driving on the right side of the road. During the French Revolution, Napoleon enforced a keep-right rule in France and in all countries he occupied.

The English, however, didn't drive huge wagons and the driver sat on the right side of the wagon seat, so that when he whipped the horses the whip wouldn't get hung-up on the load behind him. Because of this, the English continued to drive on the left side of the road and this practice continues to this day.

DID YOU KNOW the first caravan club in Queensland was formed in 1949 by Alex Chesney, a Chermside caravan dealer which was known as the Caravan Club of Australia, Brisbane Branch. In 1955, it's name was changed the Queensland Caravan Club. Alex's son Neil, a caravan manufacturer and a long-time member of the Queensland Caravan Club, formed the Chesney Caravan Club which later changed its name to the Carousel Caravan Club.

Recently QCC received an email from Leeonie and Ray who are the owners of the Killarney Sundown Motel and Tourist Park. Here is what Leeonie had to say:

further four unpowered.
