Next Rally ~ Jandowae (Showground), 11-16 September. Arrive no earlier than 12 midday, Wednesday 11th September and leave no later than 10:00am Tuesday 16th September. Showground located at the southern end of Warra Street.

From Brisbane: follow the Warrego Highway (A2) to Dalby, then take Jandowae Road (B2). Approximately 258k (3.25 minutes). Turn left into Myall Street, then left into Warra Street and into the showground.

Northside: follow the D'Aguilar Highway to Nanango, then left onto the Nanango-Tarong Road and follow through to Kumbia, then left onto the Bunya Highway. After approx. 12km, turn right into Niagara Road to Jandowae. On arrival Jandowae, turn left into Myall Street, then left into Warra Street and into the showground. GPS probably a must if taking this route. Approx. 286k (3.5 hours).

A Little about Jandowae .... Jandowae is 200km north-west of Brisbane and 45km north-west of Dalby. Situated in the western Darling Downs, Jandowae was the principal town of the former Wambo Shire. It is thought that the name was derived from an Aboriginal word describing a camp, waterhole or place on the Jandowae Creek. During the early 1900s it was spelled Jandowaie and Jondowaie.

The Jandowae provisional school was opened in 1887. Most inhabitants were graziers or station owners, and the post office directory of 1897-98 recorded a school enrolment of 11, one store in the village and the recorded the Jandowae Butter Factory, the Exchange and the

Commercial Hotel. The opening-up of farm selections in the early 1900s brought an influx of population, and the post office directory of 1911

Commercial Hotels, two stores and 94 selectors, over four times the number of six years before.

A railway from Dalby to Jandowae had been proposed in 1905 and it was completed in 1914. During that decade additional services were added to the town: two banks, a cordial manufacturer, a hairdresser, stock and station agents, a third store and a third hotel.

During the early post-war years, Jandowae's population rose to about 1000 people. There were dairying and other grazing in about equal amounts, with a local show society, a hospital, the Roxy Picture Theatre, two motor garages and Anglican (1917), Catholic (1909) and Presbyterian (1921) churches.

Dairying declined but agriculture was diversified among meat cattle, piggeries, sheep and lambs, cereals, oilseeds and legumes. A decline in population was arrested during the early 2000s by the sale of low-cost house blocks in the town.

Jandowae has a memorial hall, community and cultural centre (signifying a move of the former shire's focus out of Dalby), a supermarket and local shops, three hotels, a caravan park and a hospital. Outdoor recreation facilities comprise golf, bowls, a swimming pool, a racecourse and a showground. There are also a sawmill and an annual timber festival.

**Some Good-Gen on Jandowae ...** Historic Athlone Cottage is walking distance from the showground. Morning tea is available if a bulk booking is made and can accommodate a booking of 80 or more.

There are two hotels in town; the Exchange Hotel and the Jandowae Hotel/ Motel. The Exchange Hotel has a good recommendation for meals plus it has a beer garden at the rear where your pet is welcome. Also in town is a specialist



butcher, a Spar supermarket which is walking distance from the showground. There is also the bowls club which adjoins

the showground. The golf course is five kilometres out of town.

Jimbour House is an historical site and homestead in the neighbouring town of Jimbour about 20 minutes drive back towards Dalby. The cost is a gold coin donation and this gets access to the grounds only. The house is a private residence with a sealed airfield and perhaps the owner would open-up the house to a group. n 1959 my parents bought a diary farm in Gympie and grew small crops in between milking times. In 1963, after four years of milking twice-a-day, seven-days-a-week saw dad and mum sellout and buy the take-away store in Samford.

I had my first right hip reconstruction in 1962; an attempt to fix me after a serious buster from a horse in 1957. I worked in the shop in Samford while recovering and learning to walk again. After two years of long hours and seven-days-a-week they sold-out and moved to Maroochydore.

I got a job at Austral Motors at New Farm in Brisbane and stayed in Brisbane for a few years eventually moving to Maroochydore to join dad in a pest control business we started in 1966. The best thing in my life happened when I met Carmel at a mutual friends engagement party and we were married in 1968. After developing the business sufficiently we moved from Maroochydore to Caboolture in 1970 to further develop the business in the Caboolture shire.

Our son Matthew was born in 1971 and our daughter Melissa in 1973. We started caravanning in 1972 with our family and have never grown tired of traveling every bit of spare time we could find. Carmel was my office girl all the years we were in business, we decided to sell Caboolture Pest Control and have a change and work for somebody else.

I worked for a flower business till my hip eventually had to be totally replaced 1988. After recovering again, we decided to start Bridges Pest Control from scratch and it took a few years to develop the business to the size where we needed another technician and as our son, Matthew, who was a plumber for many years wanted a change so we decided to bring him into the business with us which made for a very busy time for Carmel in the office. In 1998, I had to have my right hip replaced again, and three months of being looked after by my secretary, I got back on my feet again.

The business was getting larger and larger, and by 2005, I was falling to bits again, so Carmel and I decided to take the advice of my orthopedic specialist and retire while I could still walk and before I fell to bits again.

Matthew and his wife Kate took over Bridges Pest Control and still run the business today. Carmel and I did seven months on our round Australia trip in 2007. Matthew and Kate have two children Max and Laura, and our daughter Melissa and her husband Warren have two daughters, Tashi and Astrid.

We were very fortunate to join the Queensland Caravan Club in 2003 and have gained some good friends and enjoyed great fellowship with the club.

I am very fortunate to still be able to enjoy the best things in my life which are my lovely wife Carmel, our children and our grandchildren, our friends, caravanning, and of course, fishing, and did I mention fishing?

We have been living in Wamuran for the past twenty five years and find it very central for our needs. We hope everyone in the QCC enjoys the fun and fellowship that Carmel and I continue to enjoy today.

## **Steve The Quokka**

Did you know that Rottnest Island, off the coast of Western Australia, got its name from a 17<sup>th</sup> century Dutch captain who mistook its diminutive marsupials for large rats, thus calling the island 'Rotte Nest'.

mammal native to Rottnest is 'quokka', and they can be found all over the island. They are most active at night, preferring to rest in the shade during daylight hours.

Usually, the quokka hops and bounds on the ground, but when it needs to, it can climb trees, too. It sits on its hind legs to survey its surroundings, but uses its front paws to find and to pick-up food.

Rottnest Island is home to roughly 20,000 quokkas; the largest known population of the creatures in the world. Because of their cute, wallaby-like appearance, they have become a major tourist attraction on the island. They are also easy to spot, and have a friendly demeanour.

In January 2017, an enterprising little quokka dubbed Steve, escaped on a rubbish barge. Western Australian police even issued an appeal for information, hoping to return Steve to his home. 

nyone travelling north-west from Jandowae and looking for a peaceful overnight stop, then consider Alwyn Francis Bridge (Lat: 26°36'41"S Long: 151°57'0"E).

Located 11km south-west of Kingaroy, 17km north-east of Kumbia on northern side of Bunya Highway and the eastern bank of Stuart River. Plenty of space and beside river, but don't bank on water. Showers, basic toilets and a limited stay of 20 hours. Remember, rest areas are there for you to rest, making your trip safer




and more enjoyable. They are not long-term camping sites. However, motorists are able to take extended rest breaks at some sites. Rules on the length of stay at rest areas vary between controlling authorities.

Remember, too, that rest areas are not designed to be camping grounds or caravan parks.

Using rest areas for multiple overnight stays as part of a planned itinerary is not in keeping with their intended purpose.

Caravans and motorhomes are not considered heavy vehicles, and should not stop at heavy vehicle locations.



## ULURU: AUSTRALIA'S ICONIC NATURAL WONDER

Heading through the red centre on your way to Albany National Rally? Yes? Then here's some good-gen on Uluru.

Uluru is Australia's best-known natural landmark. In 1873, Australian explorer William Gosse named the familiar red monolith 'Ayres Rock' after Sir Henry Ayres who was the 8th Premier of South Australia. Sir Henry served five times as Premier between 1863 and 1873. The rock's formation spans 600 million years, with indigenous Australians occupying the area for the past 10,000 years.

Renamed Ayres Rock/Uluru in 1993 and then Uluru/Ayres Rock in 2002, the iconic landmark measures 348 metres high, 3.6 kilometres long, and 1.9 kilometres wide. It is estimated to weigh



Though many believe Uluru to be the biggest monolith in the world, the title actually belongs to Mount Augustus in Western Australia.

In November 2017 the landmark decision was made by the traditional owners and the Uluru-Kata Tjuta National Park Board to close the climb for good. Effective 26 October 2019, marking the 34th anniversary of the Uluru hand-back, the climb will be closed indefinitely.

## Synopsis of What's-Up-The-Road


