*Origins of the Hot Cross Bun  
- Why we have them at Easter*



A hot cross bun is a spiced sweet bun usually made with fruit, marked with a cross on the top, and traditionally eaten on Good Friday in the United Kingdom; Ireland; Australia; India; New Zealand; South Africa; and some parts of the Americas, including Canada and the United States.

The bun marks the end of Lent and different parts of the hot cross bun have a certain meaning, including the cross representing the crucifixion of Jesus, and the spices inside signifying the spices used to embalm him at his burial.

They are now available all year round in some places. Hot cross buns may go on sale in the United Kingdom, Australia and New Zealand even as early as New Year's Day or after Christmas.

**Next Caravan Rally—Hillview—May 2021**

Hillview occupies a section of Christmas Creek valley where it is joined by Widgee Creek. Hillview's eastern boundary is marked by the high point of Jinbroken Range.

The town was once a stop on the Beaudesert Shire Tramway.



Christmas Creek Provisional opened on 5 July 1887 (higher up the creek than a previous Christmas Creek Provisional School). In 1901, it became Christmas Creek State School. In 1914, the school was renamed Hillview State School

Hillview has a population of 74 at the 2016 census. The locality contains 25 households, in which 46.5% of the population are males and 53.5% of the population are females with a median age of 51, 13 years above the national average. The average weekly household income is \$1,050, \$388 below the national average.

**CARD KIT TOOLS NEEDED FOR CLASS:**

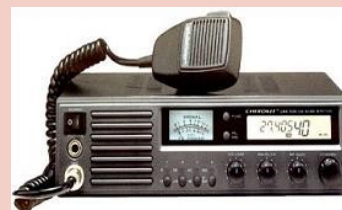
A golden rule of CB etiquette is to keep it short and to the point. Other people may not wish to hear constant talking within you convoy.

The Term “ over” means that you finished speaking and expect a reply. “ Out” means that you are finished speaking and do not expect a reply.

The use of these terms is mentioned in legislation and should be sued so that other drivers know what you are doing.

## The Story of QCC's Bulletin

For QCC's 72<sup>nd</sup> birthday, I thought I'd tell you the story of 'QCC Wanderer', how it was born and how it evolved.

In the General Meeting on 20 July 1962 Martin Lather made a motion that the club publish a monthly bulletin to be named 'The Wanderer', that the sum of 4/- be set aside from each member's annual subscription for the publication, and that copies of the publication be forwarded by post to all members of the club. This motion was duly passed.

I can't help but note that the first 'The Wanderer' is dated June 1962, but its use was only passed by members at the general meeting in July 1962! Now, how did this happen?

Although our documentation identifies this general meeting in

July 1962 as the first time the creation of the club bulletin was brought to and approved by members, we have no record of any general meeting in 1962 prior to July, and no record of any general meeting at all during 1961. That we do not have record does not mean that there were no General Meetings, and so members may well have been officially aware of its creation.

The first time any sort of publication was mentioned officially was at the committee meeting on 2<sup>nd</sup> May 1962, when President Muggerridge suggested having a booklet printed to advise members the locations of future rallies, to include suitable advertisements to cover the cost of printing. The decision was held over to the next meeting on 21<sup>st</sup> May 1962, when Merv Lather, who was congratulated on his prototype booklet 'The Wanderer', was appointed Publicity Officer (now

called 'The Editor'). It was also suggested that 'The Wanderer' be sent to members before the next rally on 2<sup>nd</sup> to 4<sup>th</sup> June! So, even though it had not been approved by members, this 'prototype' in fact became the first 'The Wanderer'. Further, it looks like the edition dated July 1962 was also printed and despatched prior to its official approval at the general meeting in July 1962.

So, 'The Wanderer', as it was initially called, was born - June, July or August edition - take your pick.

The first 'The Wanderer', dated June 1962, was typed on a typewriter (no computers then), and the graphic work on the front page was produced by hand. No photographs or advertisements were included for quite some years after the initial bulletin. I believe that the early bulletins were roneoed for mass production. Later on they were pro-

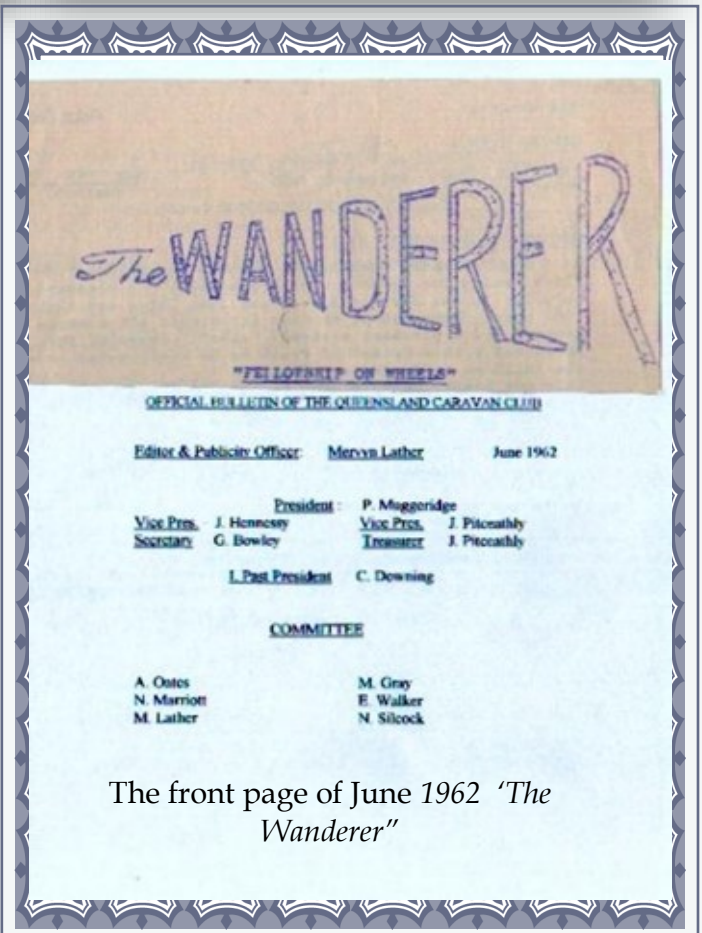
Continued from page 10A Report from the President first appeared in the July 1996 edition, originally called 'Col's Corner', and a photograph of President Col was added in the September 1996 edition; but there were no other members' photos. The first time members' photos started appearing in "The Wanderer" was in October 2002. This practice has grown over the years and these days the 'QCC Wanderer' is full of members' photos.

In the earlier years 'The Wanderer' was despatched to members by post. As we moved into the electronic age, it was agreed at the General Meeting on 3<sup>rd</sup> July 2010, to trial sending 'The Wanderer' via email as well as maintaining the current postal system for all members who did not have or did not wish to receive 'The Wanderer' via email. These days, very few of the bulletins are despatched by post.

At the General Meeting on 9 November 2013, it was decided to change the name of QCC's bulletin to 'QCC Wanderer', as it is still named today. The first bulletin with the name 'QCC Wanderer' was the December 2013 edition.

Well, that's the story of 'The Wanderer' and 'QCC Wanderer' - just keep on enjoying it!

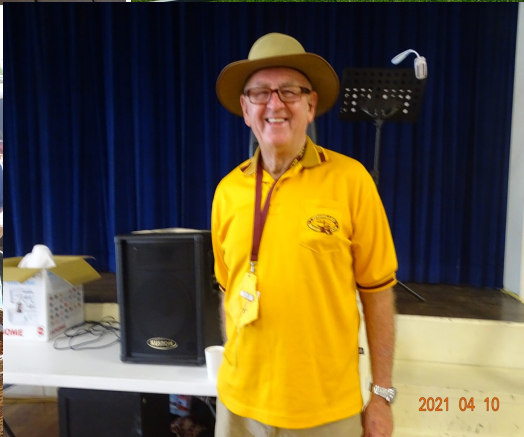

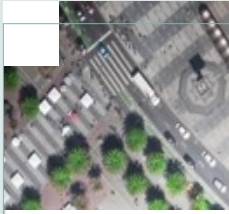
