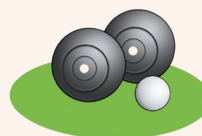

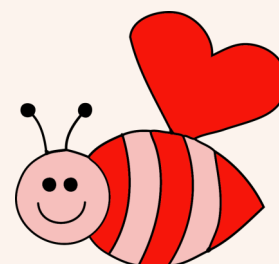

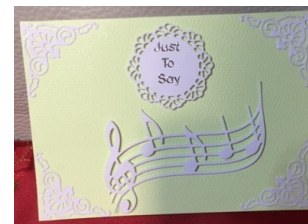

70 CM OUTER FABRIC

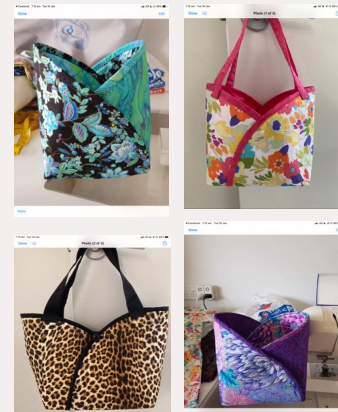
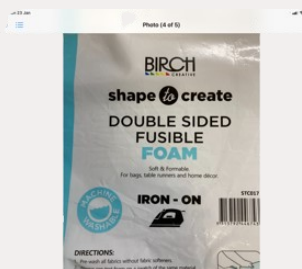
70 CM LINING

Only record kept by organisers will be weight loss/gained (i.e. 500g)

If you gain weight or don’t weigh-in (if you’re at the rally) you lose \$1.00.

At the end of the challenge you will receive your \$5.00 back if you have continued to have a weight loss or stayed the same weight.

Others will receive back any of their remaining fee.

Funds forfeited will go to the person who has the greatest percentage of weight loss.

Other assorted cloth and material – used to make bags to hang off wheelchairs and bibs for the elderly.

Ribbons and lace – decorations on coat hangers, gifts.

Wool – turned into mittens, booties, and beanies for premature babies.

Other wool scraps – in the aftermath of bush fires turned into capes and mittens for koalas.

Wool – made into knee rugs, socks, scarves, and beanies for residents in nursing homes and the homeless.

Motel soap, shampoo, and conditioner – given to Domestic Violence Connect.

Used greeting cards and old calendars – used for scrap books especially for patients in children's hospitals.

Tea bag paper tags – collected for wheelchair charities.

ABOUT DAYBORO

Dayboro, on Terrors Creek a short distance north of where the creek joins the North Pine River, is 38 km north-west of central Brisbane. First named Hamilton (1875), then Terrors Creek (1892) after a noted stallion in the district, the village's name was changed to Dayboro in 1917 to avoid confusion with Torrens Creek. 'Dayboro' apparently derives from the name of a selector, William Day, who planted sugar and established a sugar mill in the area around 1869.

The sugar mill lasted until about 1883, with the cane fields being turned over to growing maize and pasture in the 1880s. Bricks from the mill were used for Dayboro's first store and hotel. Late in the 1890s an Orange lodge hall and a Catholic church were opened, and a Presbyterian church followed in 1900. The marketing of locally-grown fruit crops was assisted with the opening of a branch railway line from Enoggera to Dayboro in 1920, the branch closing in 1955. Dairying was also quite extensive. In 1924 *Pugh's Queensland directory* recorded Dayboro as having a cooperative butter factory, three sawmillers, a motor garage and several stores. The state primary school had opened in 1920.

After World War II a Lutheran church and a memorial showground (c1955) and recreation reserve were added to Dayboro. Dairying and other local primary industries have declined in recent decades. At around an hour from Brisbane's CBD, Dayboro has become an increasingly popular rural-residential locale for 'tree-changers' from the metropolitan area, with residential subdivisions taking over former pasturelands.

The town has a swimming pool, information centre, hotel, and a State primary school.

The Dayboro Day Festival (1991) is held annually on the last Sunday in May.

EMERGENCY RESPONSE PROCEDURE

WHEN RESPONDING TO EMERGENCY ALARM BRING

A MOBILE PHONE

FIRST AID KIT

FIRE EXTINGUISHER

QUEENSLAND CARAVAN CLUB INC

This emergency response procedure directs you:-

To react to an emergency as quickly as possible; and

Not to place your life or the life of anyone else in danger.

1 IF YOU ARE AT THE SCENE OF THE EMERGENCY RAISE ALARM any way possible such as:

Sound car horn continuously or instruct someone to do so.

Call out for help.

Bang on caravan walls.

Turn on car head lights, indicators or hazard lights, especially at night.

2 ACTIVATE EMERGENCY PLUS APP.

Open App on your phone.

Follow prompts.

DIAL 000 AND FOLLOW INSTRUCTIONS.

Details of the nearest street or intersection and GPS Co-ordinates are in the Club's First Aid Kit and are published in the QCC Wanderer.

3 IF YOU HEAR AN ALARM go quickly to the scene of the emergency.

4 COMMITTEE MEMBERS TO MANAGE SCENE UNTIL PROFESSIONAL HELP ARRIVES.

Preferably two committee members to act as follows:-

One to assist at the emergency scene; and

The other to manage communication with Emergency Services and with other QCC members.

5 A COMMITTEE MEMBER TO DIRECT OTHERS.

To wait at entry point to direct emergency vehicles within the grounds.

Some members may be required at intermediate points to help with directions for emergency vehicles.

6 IF YOUR ASSISTANCE IS NOT NEEDED AT THE SCENE OF THE EMERGENCY,

Go to the designated **Emergency Assembly Point** and await instructions. If the **Emergency Assembly Point** has not been designated go to the main entrance of the hall and await instructions.

BE FAMILIAR WITH THIS EMERGENCY RESPONSE PROCEDURE

AND ALWAYS RESPOND TO AN ALARM.
