


A Thank You Note from Patrick & Ann Hetherman

This remarkable town has a rich tapestry of history quite unlike any of the early settlements in the Scenic Rim. The original inhabitants that came to settle in the area were predominately of German descent. In this little town there were not just the Smiths, Browns or Jones, but household names like Weinholts,

Krauses and Dieckmanns. These pioneering German families invested their future in an area that was so far away from their original European birthplace.

In 1879 the name – 'Engelsburg' was chosen for the then thriving settlement. Unfortunately the town's name was short lived. 40 years on, during World War 1, anti-German sentiment had grown around the area.

In 1916 the Government ordered the town be renamed with a local Aboriginal word - 'Kalbar'.

The meaning of this indigenous word has been the subject of much conjecture, but

in the end, it was accepted that the meaning was 'bright' or 'star'.

The Royal Hotel – C. 1900. Is one of the two original Kalbar hotels and was originally owned by Hans and Matilda Nielsen. Unfortunately, a disastrous fire in February 1920 erased most of the



buildings in Edward Street, including the original School of Arts hall. The Bickerton's building which sits on the corner of Edward and George Streets is the only building on that side of the road to have survived the fire.

Bickerton's building – C. 1908. General merchants who competed for almost 40

years with the Wiss Brothers. Both bought produce from the local farmers often with a 'Dutch' auction where the farmers bargained for the best price from their wagon in the middle of the street If you wish to know more about Kalbar please click link below



ACTIVATE EMERGENCY PLUS APP. • Open App on your phone. • Follow prompts. OR DIAL 000 AND FOLLOW INSTRUCTIONS. Details of the nearest street or intersection and GPS Co-ordinates are in the Club's First Aid Kit and in the QCC Wanderer. COMMITTEE MEMBERS TO MANAGE SCENE UNTIL **PROFESSIONAL HELP ARIVES.** Preferably two committee members to act as follows:-• One to assist at the emergency scene; • The other to manage communication with Emergency Services and with other QCC members. A COMMITTEE MEMBER TO DIRECT OTHERS. To wait at entry point to direct emergency vehicles within the grounds. Some members may be required at intermediate points to help with directions for emergency vehicles. IF YOUR ASSISTANCE IS NOT NEEDED AT THE SCENE OF THE EMERGENCY, Go to the designated Emergency Assembly Point and await instructions. If the Emergency Assembly Point has not been designated go to the main entrance of the hall and await instructions. BE FAMILIAR WITH THIS EMERGENGY PROCEDURE

PET POLICY AT QCC RALLIES

This Policy applies whilst at a rally site for the whole duration of the rally dates, i.e. upon arrival on site until departure. This Policy runs in conjunction with any other "Pet" policy imposed by the venue at which our rally is being held.

We must remember that although many of us enjoy pets, not all club members are pet lovers. However, if we abide by a few simple rules, there is no reason why we cannot all be happy. (Refer to the By-Law No. 19 for further details).

It is important to be aware that:

Pet owners/carers are responsible for keeping their pets quiet at all times. Barking dogs will not be tolerated as this can be disturbing to other members.

- Pets must be restrained and kept within the confines of the owner/carer's caravan/annex.
- Pets are always to be kept on a short leash or other type of restraint.
- When walking a Pet, it must be on a short leash or other type of restraint and be in the hands of a responsible adult.
- Pets must not be off their leash anywhere on the rally site. (The only exception to this rule is if a specific area designated for this purpose is provided by the venue.)
- Pets are not permitted in the following areas:
 - i. Unless taking a Pet for a walk, it must be on a short leash or other type of restraint and kept within the confines of the owner/carer's caravan/annex.
 - ii. When taking a Pet for a walk, it must be on a short leash or other type of restraint and be in the hands of a responsible adult.
 - iii. Pets must not be off their leash anywhere on the rally site unless a specific area designated for this purpose is provided by the venue.
 - iv. Animal/pets must not be:
 - a. where food is eaten, being prepared and/or served,
 - b. Toilets/shower facilities,



c. The Hall or Meeting area or anywhere members gather for any social gatherings

(Pet owners must clean up any mess their pet makes)

If you are attending a rally with a Pet, please advise the Rally Marshal on your arrival.

IF WE ALL EMPLOY A LITTLE BIT OF CO-OPERATION AND COMMON SENSE, OUR MEMBERS WILL BE HAPPY NEIGHBOURS.
