### President's Report Nanango (Kalbar) Rally October 2022

With just less than two weeks' notice, club Secretary Carol was advised by the Kalbar Show Society that they had cancelled our rally booking due to flooding and damage to their site. Carol advised me of the situation while we were holidaying in Dublin, Republic of Ireland. She also advised all club members and our known visitors of the situation so everyone could make the necessary preparations for a different but unknown alternative rally venue.

In short order Carol organised Nanango Showgrounds as the alternative rally site. The club is very grateful for Carol's successful effort in organising an alternate venue and to the Nanango Show Society for accepting our booking at such short notice. We are also grateful for the flexibility of our members many of whom had to significantly change their travel plans to attend a new rally site.

The Nanango Showgrounds are situated high on firm ground in the Nanango township which is in the South Burnett region on the edge of the Great Dividing Range an easy two-hour drive from Brisbane. Unfortunately, we were unable to secure use of the big hall, but we were able to use the Ted Nielsen Pavilion which while being much smaller proved adequate for our purposes.

Pleasingly a total of 51 units attended the rally. A total of 28 units arrived on Wednesday with the balance arriving by Friday. This reflected a recent trend whereby a significant proportion of units are arriving at the earliest opportunity. While all sites were on firm ground every unit required some form of levelling assistance. Fine weather was experienced during daylight hours each day with some rain on Thursday evening and Sunday morning.

Fortunately, the program organised by Pat, the clubs Entertainment Co-ordinator for Kalbar could be applied at Nanango with minimal change. Golf was played on both Thursday and Friday mornings. The Nanango Bowls Club accepted a short notice booking for a nominal 20 bowlers to play on Thursday afternoon. They demonstrated their flexibility and welcoming approach by accepting 42 bowlers on the day. Lawn bowls is becoming very popular amongst both male and female club members.

Our other regular Thursday and Friday activities such as Card making, Sewing, Crafty ladies, Cards/Board Games, and Mental Health and Wellbeing were well supported. The 6.30am walker numbers varied each day depending on the amount of sunshine available. A small number of members also explored and exercised by bicycle. On Friday night over 40 members supported both the RSL club and the local pub for dinner. A highlight of Saturdays club forum was the induction of four new members. Wayne and Leona Meacham and Gavin and Rosemary Prisk were welcomed into the club.

The Oktoberfest theme for Saturday night was organised by Yvonne Robbins and embraced by members many of whom dressed for the occasion wearing various interpretations of German traditional dress. A delicious Oktoberfest dinner consisting of a German sausage, Sauerkraut & mustard in a roll, followed by Apple Strudel, Custard & Cream was prepared and served by members under the direction of our Convenor Gail & Ray Caddies with Wendy Gibson playing some traditional German music in the background. Dinner was followed by some fun group participatory games and dancing.

Happy hours throughout the rally were organised at the individual level apart from Sunday when a group sausage sizzle was held.

We head north to Imbil for our November rally to be held from 9-14 Nov. The Clubs annual Open Singles Disc Bowls competition will be held during this rally.

Despite the challenges of a changed venue and modified program, members experienced "fellowship on wheels" at its best.



### **Directions to Imbil Rally November 2022**

From Brisbane: Travel north on the M1 (Bruce Highway) and at approximately 16 kilometres north of Cooroy turnoff, take the Mary River Tourist Drive to the left and continue to the T-intersection with the Mary Valley Road. Turn left and follow the Mary Valley Road for approximately six kilometres then veer right onto the Kandanga/Imbil Road and follow through to Imbil a distance of about eight kilometres. At the T-intersection, turn right into Yabba Creek Road (Imbil's main street) and then take the second street on the left (Edward Street). The entrance to the showground is just past the showground hall on the right opposite the Mary Valley State College. Word of Warning: Edward Street is a one-way street. On exiting the showground, be sure to turn right and follow Edward Street around to the Imbil/Brooloo Road.

Everyone participating needs to bring the following:


- 1. A pot with holes in the bottom. Pot can be any shape you choose but keep it reasonably small (roughly 150mm by 300mm)
- 2. \$10 for plant and soil I will provide these.


Please bring along any existing bonsai, so we can look at trimming and/or repotting them.

### **IMBIL** Oueensland.

Is a rural town in the Mary River Valley, is 30 km south of Gympie and 120 km north-west of central Brisbane. Named after the Imbil homestead and pastoral run, it is thought that the name was derived from an Aboriginal word that described scrub vine.

The area was taken up as a sheep-grazing run in the early 1850s, it changed to a cattle run when the sheep were found to suffer from foot rot and the effects of spear grass.

In the late 1860s a consolidated Imbil cattle station was formed. By then, gold fossickers were working southwards from Gympie. The Boyd's Hill find (1868) was made about a mile from the Imbil homestead. However, as the easily won alluvial gold ran out there was some pressure for farm selections, which occurred in the Mary Valley in 1869.

The formation of a township was several decades away: a provisional school was not opened until 1897, and township lots were sold only a short time before the opening of the railway from Gympie in 1915. This activity coincided with the cutting up and sale of the Imbil run.

The first Imbil Post Office opened on 9 July 1870 and closed in 1872. The second office opened in 1877 and closed in 1907. The third office opened by 1919. An Imbil Railway Station Post Office opened in 1917 and closed in 1920.

By the 1920s Imbil had a population of about 600 people. Pugh's Queensland Directory (1925) recorded several stores, a bank, a joinery works and three sawmills in Imbil.

The sawmills removed much of the naturally occurring hoop and bunya pine, and by 1919 the Imbil forest station had been opened and a tree nursery established.

Imbil is the largest village in the Mary Valley, located in the Gympie region in South-East Queensland, Australia, with an estimated population now, of 1000 people. Imbil is often referred to as the Jewel of the Mary Valley.

Imbil has a warm community with many active groups, and that, combined with its picturesque main street perched on the banks of Yabba Creek, is one of its main attractions.

Some visitors come to try their luck fishing at Borumba Dam, where the saratoga is a common catch, or to pack a picnic and take the four-wheel-drive for a run to Jimna, kayak on the creek, or to simply soak up the country air and slow down

The town is also home to the motor rally event, the International Rally of Queensland, a long running event on the Queensland and Australian Rally Championships. It was recently promoted to international standing as a round of the Asia Pacific Rally Championship. Stages are held in surrounding forests and the showgrounds are converted into the garage facilities for approximately 70 race cars over the course of the three-day event.
