Members' Responsibilities

- 1 To abide by all Queensland Caravan Club Inc. bylaws and rules.
- 2 Report all safety issues to a Committee Member.
- 3 To have a safe 15-amp power lead preferably safety checked annually.
- 4 Sign the attendance book on arrival at rallies.
- 5 Follow direction of rally marshals.
- 6 Respond to emergency alarm.
- 7 Electrical leads and water hoses to be flat on the ground and to be positioned behind vans (whenever possible).
- 8 No expenditure or action to be undertaken in Queensland Caravan Clubs Inc. name without pre-approval of the committee.
- 9 All complaints are to be in writing to the secretary by the next Committee meeting after the particular rally.
- 10 All vehicles to be driven or ridden at walking pace while at rally sites.
- 11 Individual activities e.g. throwing a cricket ball are to be carried out in areas with due consideration to people and objects.
- 12 No excessive noise after 10 pm.
- 13 Show respect to other members.
- 14 Awning ropes are to be placed as vertically as possible to reduce trip hazards.
- To be responsible for the control of their vehicle at all times.
- 16 Members with animals to abide by the QCC's Pet Policy.

(The only exception to this rule is if a specific area designated for this purpose is provided by the venue.) Pets are not permitted in the following areas:

- where food is eaten,
- being prepared and/or served,
- toilets/shower facilities,
- the Hall or Meeting area or anywhere members gather for any social gatherings

Pet owners must clean up any mess their pet makes.

If you are attending a rally with a Pet, please advise the Rally Marshal on your arrival.

QUEENSLAND CARAVAN CLUB INC. EMERGENCY PROCEDURE

This Emergency Procedure directs you:-

To react to an emergency as quickly as possible; and

Not to place your life or the life of anyone else in danger.

IF YOU HEAR THE ALARM OR ARE AT THE SCENE OF THE EMERGENCY, RAISE ALARM any way possible such as:

Sound car horn continuously or instruct someone to do so.

Call out for help.

Bang on caravan walls.

Turn on car head lights, indicators or hazard lights, especially at night.

ASSESS EMERGENCY AND TAKE ACTION AS REQUIRED.

ACTIVATE EMERGENCY PLUS APP IF REQUIRED.

Open App on your phone.

Follow prompts.

DIAL 000 AND FOLLOW INSTRUCTIONS.

Details of the nearest street or intersection are in the Club's First Aid Kit and in the "QCC Wanderer".

A COMMITTEE MEMBER WILL BRING THE DEFIBRILLATOR, FIRST AID BOX AND FIRE EXTINGUISHER.

IF REQUIRED, OPEN AND FOLLOW PROMPTS ON THE DEFIBRILLATOR.

COMMITTEE MEMBERS TO MANAGE SCENE UNTIL PROFESSIONAL HELP ARRIVES.

Preferably two committee members to act as follows:-

One to assist at the emergency scene; and

The other to manage communication with Emergency Services and with other QCC members.

A COMMITTEE MEMBER TO DIRECT OTHERS.

To wait at entry point to direct emergency vehicles within the grounds.

Some members may be required at intermediate points to help with directions for emergency vehicles.

IF YOUR ASSISTANCE IS NOT NEEDED AT THE SCENE OF THE EMERGENCY,

Go to the designated **Emergency Assembly Point** and await instructions. If the **Emergency Assembly Point** has not been designated go to the main entrance of the hall and await instructions.

BE FAMILIAR WITH THIS EMERGENGY PROCEDURE AND ALWAYS RESPOND TO AN ALARM.
