RISK ASSESSMENT: If the risk is not acceptable then you do not do it!

Members Performing Tasks at Rallies

- 1. All activities to have pre-approval of committee.
- 2. Members performing tasks/activities must be familiar with Risk Assessment and Procedures for that activity prior to undertaking task/activity.

Rally Marshal

Risk Assessment - Moderate

<u>Perceived Concerns</u> e.g. ground surface, posts, overhead power lines, entry and exits etc.

- 1 Ground surface (Obstructions, holes).
- 2 Space between vans.
- 3 Overhanging trees or branches.
- 4 People standing behind vans when vehicle & van reversing.
- 5 Space in front of vans to allow for emergency vehicle entry.
- 6 Space so that vehicle can be connected to van at any time.
- 7 Allow an emergency exit for all vans at all times.
- 8 Parking of tow vehicles.
- 9 Visibility of rally marshals.
- 10 Communication between rally marshals and between rally marshals and drivers.
- Sun protection of rally marshals.
- 12 Special needs members.

Convening

Risk Assessment - Moderate

<u>Perceived Concerns</u> e.g. electrical leads location, position of urns, people behind urns etc.

- 1 Scalding
- 2 Tripping over leads.
- 3 Slipping on wet floor.
- 4 Number of people in serving area.
- 5 Electrical safety.
- 6 Health considerations.
- 7 Adequacy of benches and tables.
- 8 Boisterous behaviour near urns.
- 9 Emptying urns of hot water.
- 10 Opening urn lids.
- 11 Food handling.

Entertainment

Risk Assessment - Low

<u>Perceived Concerns</u> e.g. surface where activity held, posts, age of participants, lighting, temperature etc.

- 1 Suitability of venue for particular activity e.g. floor, posts.
- 2 Possibility of tripping on electrical leads.
- 3 Age group of participants.
- 4 Suitable appropriate clothing e.g. covered shoes.
- 5 Safety of electrical equipment used.
- 6 Members acting in a dangerous manner.
