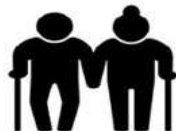

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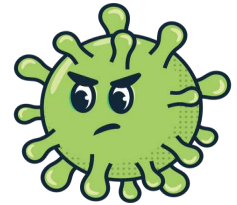


## COVID-19 UPDATE JULY 2024

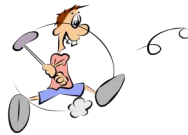

Oven Mitt suitable for both right and left handed cooks.



### Requirements

- 2 x 14" x 11" Main fabric – must be pure cotton
- 2 x 14" x 11" Lining Fabric – must be pure cotton
- 2 x 14" x 11" Cotton Wadding
- 2 x 14" x 11" Insul-Bright
- 1 x 2 1/2" width of fabric strip – maybe contrast, same as lining or same as outer fabric – up to you.
- Sewing thread – you can either contrast or blend for your quilting.
- Marking pencil that will stand out on your main Fabric. Ruler, Sharp scissors, Walking Foot for machine.

For those that don't want to go to the expense buying full amounts of the wadding and the Insul-bright I am happy to put together kits of both i.e. 2 pieces of each already cut to size for \$8.00 but I will need names by 1 August.
