#### MEMBERS MEDICAL INFORMATION

It is recommended that members have a Personal Medical Record and details displayed in your RV to assist Ambulance staff and others in case of an emergency. This information should include any medical conditions, medications and In Case of Emergency (I.C.E.) contact/s. Please see Bob or Jeanette Chaffey for booklets.

#### DO NOT FORGET TO KEEP THIS UPDATED

NOTE: It is recommended that a Personal Medical Record be displayed in your home and in the car.



# **COVID-19 INFORMATION & CONTACTS IF REQUIRED**

**TO: QCC members & visitors:** 

(Q) Do you still need to isolate?

(A) Anyone diagnosed with COVID-19 can pass the virus onto others. While isolation is no longer a legal requirement. During your infectious stage it's recommended to:

- avoiding contact with people who are at higher risk of severe disease
- wear a mask outside the home
- avoid going to public areas, or travel on public transport, in taxis or ride-share services
- practice good hand hygiene

If you have any appointments let them know in advance that you have COVID.

Acute symptoms include wheezing, coughing and a sore throat. If you still have acute symptoms like a cough after seven days, you may still be infectious. You should continue to wear a mask and physically distance whenever possible. You should also avoid contact with household members if possible.

Regularly clean high touch surfaces, which include doorknobs, remotes and benchtops, thoroughly with detergent and warm water.

**Ventilation is important** increasing ventilation, opening doors and windows is particularly important, you should also wear a mask if you have to be in the same room as family.

COVID sneeze etiquette of sneezing or coughing into your elbow or tissue, washing and sanitising hands remains important both within and beyond outside the van.

24 to 48 hours after your symptoms disappear it's probable that you're least infectious but if you have to leave the house/van when you have symptoms, wear a mask.


You can also do a Rapid Antigen Test, if the test is negative & your symptoms are down, you're probably okay. Consider wearing a mask.

# WHAT TO DO IF YOU ARE POSITIVE FOR COVID-19 DURING A RALLY:

If you have a positive RAT, try to remain in or around your van for the next 5 days with good ventilation (fresh air), limit going out & avoid crowded areas, if necessary, wear a mask, continue to do so for a few days after getting a negative RAT.

If you feel unwell or need COVID-19 advice speak to a nurse by calling the healthdirect helpline on 1800 022 222.







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# **EMERGENCY PROCEDURE**

IF YOU HEAR THE ALARM OR ARE AT THE SCENE OF THE EMERGENCY, RAISE ALARM any way possible such as:

Sound car horn continuously or instruct someone to do so.

Call out for help.

Bang on caravan walls.

Turn on car head lights, indicators or hazard lights, especially at night.



# THE MARSHALS' JOB CAN SOMETIMES BE CHALLENGING. YOU CAN MAKE THEIR JOB EASIER BY FOLLOWING THESE GUIDELINES.

# PLANNING YOUR FUTURE ATTENDANCE AT A CARAVAN RALLY

- 1. If you are at a caravan rally and you know you will be attending the next monthly rally, please put a mark (tick or cross) against your name on the check list for that upcoming rally. There is no need to mark this sheet other than to indicate your plan, at that point in time, to attend. The only check sheet available at any rally will be for the next rally as it is felt that putting out more sheets than this is unrealistic as a lot of things can happen in a 2 month period that are unknown when you first indicate your attendance.
- 2. Two weeks out from the next rally the Club Secretary will email out the checklist for that upcoming rally as an attachment. PLEASE OPEN THIS ATTACHEMENT and check it! If your:
  - i) Name is on the list and you are still planning on attending **DO NOTHING!**
  - ii) Name is on the list and you are <u>NOT attending Please contact the secretary by phone or email</u> and ask to have your name removed from the list.
  - iii) Name is missing from the list and you intend to go to the Rally Please contact the secretary by phone or email and ask to have it added to the list of attendees.
- 3. If you have <u>special needs</u> e.g. you have a medical or mobility condition or your van has no toilet or your needs may have changed since the last rally, please contact the Chief Rally Marshal (who's contact details will be in the 'Wanderer') and advise the Chief Rally marshal of your needs. Also advise which day you plan on arriving at the rally so the appropriate space can be reserved.
- 4. Remember that unless otherwise requested by the Committee or the Chief Rally Marshal, entry to the rally is **after 12 Noon** on the Wednesday the rally commences.
- 5. Attendees who want to arrive after 3:30pm on the Wednesday or Thursday or at any time on Friday or Saturday need to advise the Chief Rally Marshal of their expected time of arrival. If this is not done the attendee may need to park up, not connected to power & water and generally unable to setup their van until a marshal is available to put them in place. If the marshals are aware of your arrival time, in these circumstances, you will be accommodated.
- **6.** If attendees circumstances change after the Wednesday morning of the commencement of the rally, and they are no longer attending or there is a change in their arrival time to the rally ie anytime after 3:30pm on Wednesday, Thursday or Friday, or you intend to arrive anytime on a Saturday they need to make contact first with the Chief Rally Marshal and not their friends as messages via friends often do not get passed along in a timely manner.
- 7. When leaving a voicemail or sending a text message to either the Secretary or the Chief Rally Marshal please make sure you **clearly state your FULL name.**
