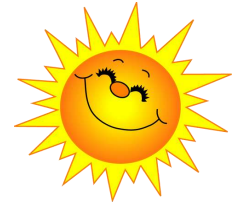

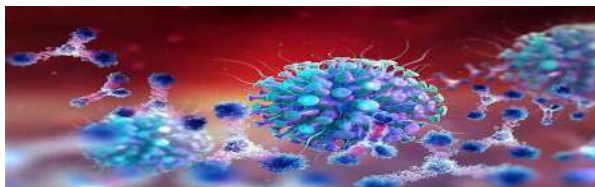

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FIRE SAFETY IN YOUR CARAVAN

Hello Members

The following is a brief description on maintaining your Fire Extinguisher fitted in your caravan.

As many of you know my previous job was a Firefighter/fire inspector and in this job I attended many caravan fires and sadly some with fatalities.

This is why I have put this simple service check on your fitted fire extinguisher.



- **Remove fire extinguisher from bracket used to secure your fire extinguisher.**
- **Take your extinguisher outside of your caravan.**
- **Lightly tap your fire extinguisher with a rubber mallet around the base of your extinguisher turning the extinguisher as you tap.**
- **If you don't have a rubber mallet, tap your extinguisher on your van tyre lightly.**
- **Check your fire extinguisher is still in serviceable date.**
- **If in doubt a new fire extinguisher is only about \$40 or less, which is cheap.**
- **Check the gauge on your fire extinguisher to make sure it is in the green area.**
- **Re install the extinguisher back in the bracket in your van.**

**I must stress that if a fire starts in your caravan vacate your van immediately
DO NOT STAY IN YOUR VAN TO TRY TO EXTINGUISH THE FIRE**

Your life is worth more than your caravan. A caravan can be replaced, you can not be replaced. If you have any questions do not hesitate to give me a call or I will come and look at your van's extinguisher at a future rally.

The pattern/s will be provided at the rally.

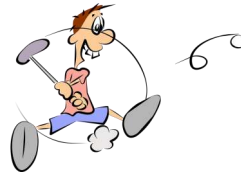

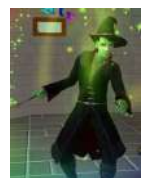

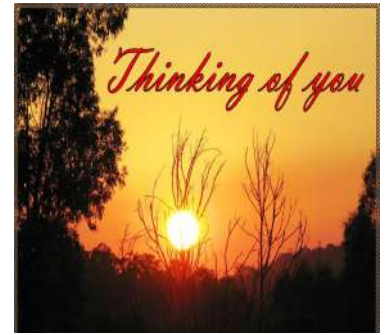

PET POLICY AT QCC RALLIES

This Policy applies whilst at a rally site for the whole duration of the rally dates, i.e. upon arrival on site until departure. This Policy runs in conjunction with any other “Pet” policy imposed by the venue at which our rally is being held.

We must remember that although many of us enjoy pets, not all club members are pet lovers. However, if we abide by a few simple rules, there is no reason why we cannot all be happy. (Refer to the By-Law No. 19 for further details).

It is important to be aware that: **Pet owners/carers are responsible for keeping their pets quiet at all times. Barking dogs will not be tolerated as this can be disturbing to other members.**

- Pets must be restrained and kept within the confines of the owner/carer’s caravan/annex.
- Pets are always to be kept on a short leash or other type of restraint.
- When walking a Pet, it must be on a short leash or other type of restraint and be in the hands of a responsible adult.
- Pets must not be off their leash anywhere on the rally site. (The only exception to this rule is if a specific area designated for this purpose is provided by the venue.)
- Pet owners must clean up any mess their pet makes
- Pets are NOT permitted in the following areas:
 - a. where food is eaten, being prepared and/or served,
 - b. Toilets/shower facilities,
 - c. The Hall or Meeting area or anywhere members gather for any social gatherings.



If you are attending a rally with a Pet, please advise the Rally Marshal on your arrival.
